To this branch of the department is confided the surveying (under the orders of the Governor-General) the waste lands of the Crown—directing surveys—examining and reporting thereon to His Excellency the Governor-General in Council—reporting on all matters relating to the surveying branch of the department—when directed by the Executive Government the preparation of descriptions of lands for the Provincial Secretary to be inserted in Patent Deeds—and entering same on maps—making searches and certificates to the same for the commissioners under the heir and devisee act, &c.
