LUSITANIA WIDOW KILLS HERSELF

Mrs. Vernon Overcome by Grief For the Loss of Her Husband

New York, July 27.—The German submarine which sank the Lusitania on May 8 has added another to her long list of women victims when the body of Mrs. G. L. P. Vernon widow of a passenger drowned when the steamer went down, was found in her home in the Summer apartments at No. 31 West Eleventh street, last week.

She had not been seen for several days and the condition of the body showed that she probably had died of a self-inflicted wound made with a revolver.

Mrs. Vernon was thirty years old and she had appeared in the Metropolitan Grand Opera House under her professional name, Miss Inez Jolivet.

She was a sister of Miss Hilda Jolivet, a well known actress to whom it is said the late Charles Frohman made his first dramatic production that death is a beautiful adventure, a few minutes before he was drawn beneath the waves that closed over the Lusitania.

Mrs. Vernon's husband was an Englishman who was on board the Lusitania. He was on his way back to London to visit his wife when the Lusitania was sunk. His body was washed ashore on the coast of Ireland on May 21.

Mrs. Vernon, who had lived in New York intermittently for three years came to the United States on board the Philadelphia three weeks ago to settle his affairs and make arrangements for the care of her husband's American estate, largely consisting of stock in a motion picture company and an interest in a real estate manufacturing.

Upon her arrival here Mrs. Vernon asked R. R. Govin, an oil merchant at No. 50 West street to act as executor of her husband's will, which has not yet been probated. Mr. Govin and Mrs. Govin were friends of the Vernons of many years standing.

Mrs. Vernon went to the home of Mr. Govin in Rosedale, N. J., on returning to New York she went directly to her apartment. After she entered the house nothing was seen of her. Frequent telephone messages were unanswered and her daily papers were piled in front of her door. Two telegraph messages, one signed "Adams," from Pittsburgh, and the other from No. 50 West street, in New York, were pushed under the door.

When a prospective tenant applied for permission to look at apartments, A. C. Wells, superintendent, who had been authorized to sublet the Vernon apartment, opened the door the body of Mrs. Vernon clad in a black evening gown was found beside her bed. The coverlets were not disturbed. The position of the body indicated that Mrs. Vernon had knelt beside her bed in prayer before she shot herself.

After the arrival of Coroner Riodan the body was lifted and the weapon with which she ended her life was found under her. There were many letters and documents in the room showing her interest in the business which brought her to the United States. Most of her clothing and household effects were found packed and ready for shipment.

Mr. Govin later said that Mrs. Vernon intended to go back to England on board the St. Paul Saturday. He sent a cable message to Arthur Jolivet father of the dead woman, asking what disposition should be made of the body.

Mr. Govin said that Mrs. Vernon often said in the last three weeks that she had nothing more to live for since her husband was dead. They had been married eight years. Mr. Govin said that financial worries could not have caused her anxiety. She collected \$20,000 of insurance on her husband's life when she arrived in the United States and still has more than \$19,000 on deposit in the Hudson Trust Company. Her moving picture interest and other business affairs were in good shape, so far as Mr. Govin knew.

RECENT DEATHS

John Eaton, of Calais, eldest son of the late Hon. Geo. H. Eaton, died suddenly in the Arcadian Hotel in that city on Sunday. He had arrived from his summer camp at Grand Lake and decided to spend the night at the hotel. Towards morning he was seized with an attack acute indigestion and passed away within a short time. He was forty-one years of age. His mother, one brother and several sisters survive.

Charles Becker, under sentence of death for instigating the murder of Herman Rosenthal, has been granted a new lease of life. His execution has been postponed until Friday, pending consideration of an application for a new trial.
