

WITH AUTOMOBILES

The French are planning to establish an automobile connection across the Sahara. Experiments are now being carried out under the control of the army ried out under the control of the army two hundred and fifty kilometres east of Timbucktoo, via In Saleh, Tamanrosset, Tinzaouten and Kidal. The total distance of 3,000 kilometres.

Kergresse intends to make the trip with six automobiles. He expects each car to make about 200 kilometres daily, so that the complete journey will take fifteen days. Each car will carry 600 kilometres of care.

fifteen days. Each car will carry 600 litres of gas.

Experiments carried out under conditions far more difficult than those appertaining to the desert have given entire satisfaction. The cars are of the caterpillar type with a rubber band invented by Engineer Hinston. If successful, it will mean the establishment of road communication throughout the whole French African empire, which is enormously important for its future development. The strategic importance is also considerable, which explains why the military authorities are so closely watching the experiment.
