Statements presented at the thirtieth annual meeting of the Excisor Life Insurance Company, Toronto, show record gains in amount of insurance written, increase in assets and insurance in force. Alex. Fasken, first vice-president, presided in the absence of the president, Mr. David Fasken.

Insurance issued and applied for totalled \$10,829,909, bringing the total insurance in force to \$38,785,247.10.

Income from premiums, interest etc., rose to \$1,899,962.08, an increase of nearly two hundred thousand dollars.

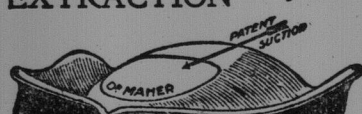
