The Project For Bridge Across St. John River at St. Leonards

What this means to Campbellton can ut be faintly conjectured but the fact emains that the delegation were satisfied with the condition and probabilities of lampbellton and district and the bridge sill be built by private enterprise.

This is the greatest progressive movement that Campbellton could wish for and o party or government is being asked for dollar.
