MILLION MEN RALLY TO BATTLE THE BALKANS... War Not Declared and There Is Yet a Chance to Avert it

Little States Staking There All on the Chance For Which They Have Been Waiting—Turkey, Meanwhile, Declared Ready For Fight—A Call Home to Bulgarians and Others in America

London, Oct. 2—The whole of the Balkan peninsula is being rapidly transformed into an armed camp. According to reports from the capitals of the various states, upwards of a million men have been ordered to gather to decide once for all, in a trial by combat, the question of changing the conditions of the inhabitants of the European provinces of Turkey.

London, Oct. 2—A cable message calling upon Bulgarians and Macedonians to return to their homes, was posted today at the headquarters of the Macedonian-Bulgarian organization in Morris street, London. The message was signed by the president of the central committee and reads: "Send all Bulgarians and Macedonians to Bulgaria."

London, Oct. 2—A cable to the Tribune from Constantinople says: "Elaborate defensive preparations occupy the leaders of the government and army. The Ottoman government trusts neither the Balkan states nor the great powers, holding that they are all ready to turn their backs on the Ottoman Empire if they see a chance to do so."

London, Oct. 2—The Vienna correspondent of the Daily Mail says he has received from an unimpeachable source an intimation that the situation in the Balkans is aggravated and that it is expected the die will be cast within the next forty-eight hours. The King of Greece is on his way to Athens and will interview Count Vorontchikov, the Austro-Hungarian foreign minister, and the Bulgarian minister in Vienna today.

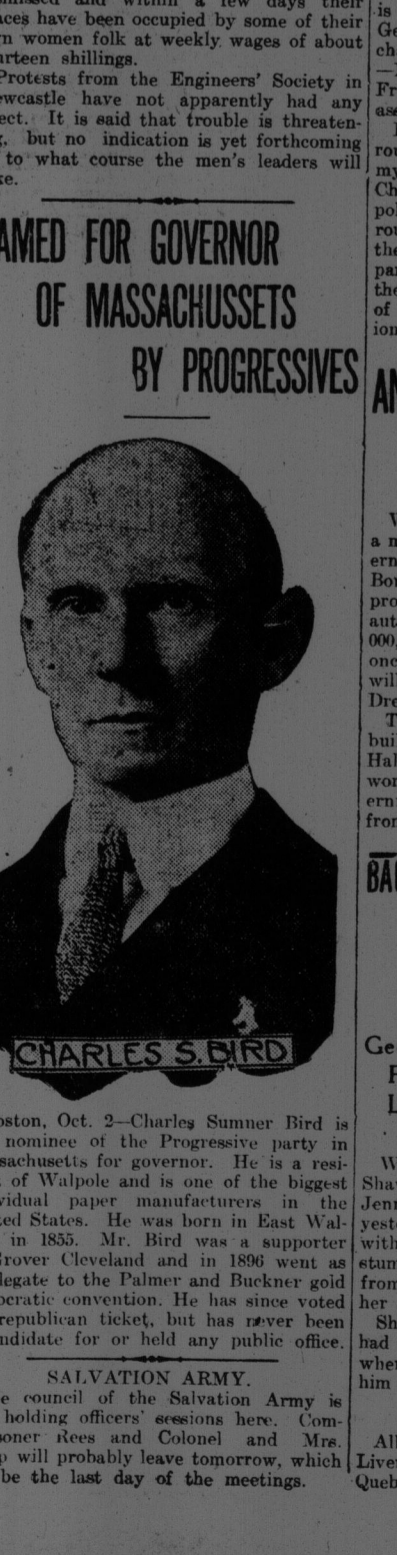
Many Hired by Papers to Report the Games—Billy Papke Declines to Meet Mantell and May Be Blacklisted
