## DETERMINE AS TO DRINKS THAT INTOXICATE

### U. S. Senator Introduces Bill for Commission to Make Inquiry.

Washington, Jan. 8.—Senator Spencer, Republican, of Missouri, has introduced in the Senate a bill for a commission to investigate the question of what alcoholic content makes a beverage intoxicating.

The proposed commission would be named by the president and consist of seven members, at least two of them women, "to investigate and determine, as far as possible, what alcoholic content in a beverage, under a fair and reasonable interpretation, makes the beverage intoxicating."

Under the bill, the commission is given the necessary power to secure information and an appropriation of \$100,000. It is to be under the supervision of the Secretary of Agriculture, who is to be an ex-officio member of the commission. The bill requires the commission to report its findings as soon as possible. Members of the commission will be paid \$750 a month.

Senator Spencer in a speech in the Senate held that the scientific demonstration of what constitutes an intoxicating beverage is necessary.

"The proposed legislation," said Senator Spencer, "to determine scientifically the percentage of alcohol that makes a beverage intoxicating is intended to be a step in the enforcement of the Eighteenth Amendment and to solidify the ranks of those who believe in its enforcement. An increasing number of Americans who do not believe in the enforcement of the amendment are striving in every way to weaken its power and to increase dissipation and its disobedience of its provisions."

"Chemists tell us that there is very often more than one-half of one percent of alcohol in buttermilk, and no one will seriously contend that buttermilk is intoxicating. The purpose of the proposed bill is to determine in a fair and scientific manner as far as human investigation can determine the question, what amount of alcohol does, in fact, make a beverage intoxicating. It is information that ought to be available."

"I can see nothing but good from such an investigation, nor can I see any substantial reason why there should be any opposition to such a measure. It will tend to satisfy the discontent of tens of thousands who believe that the present enforcement law was enacted with unwarranted restrictions and whose dissatisfaction would vanish, or, at least, substantially lessen, if they were satisfied that the law of the land was not more restrictive than of necessity it had to be in order to enforce the Eighteenth Amendment."

**LIVING COST IN GERMANY 685 TIMES HIGHER THAN BEFORE WAR**

Berlin, Jan. 8.—The cost of living in Germany increased 685 per cent. in December, the average of prices being 685 times as great as those charged before the war, according to figures published today. Clothing was 56.5 per cent. higher than in the preceding month. Foodstuffs showed the lowest increase, rising only 46.8 per cent.
