BURGLAR BEATS PASTOR WITH AXE

Feeble Victim, After Battle, Sends Him Forgiveness.

New York, July 12.—The Rev. Dr. John H. Kerr surprised a thief at work in a bedroom of his parsonage in Brooklyn, forgot his sixty-five years and his frail, slender stature, sprang at the intruder and was so badly cut and beaten with an axe that for a time it was feared he would die. Late at night Dr. Kerr, stitched and bandaged, bruised by kicks and almost too weak to talk, was sending from his sick bed through his wife messages of forgiveness for his assailant and expressions of willingness to give him a "helping hand."

Meanwhile the police of Brooklyn were making extraordinary efforts to catch the man and the fashionable Highland Park section of the borough in which the crime was committed was seething with indignation. So widely is Dr. Kerr known among Presbyterians in New York that as news of his experience spread, many anxious inquiries were made at the parsonage, adjoining the church.

Though Dr. Kerr was able to give only a mumbled, halting account of what befell him, the three-story parsonage here ample evidence of a terrific struggle, in which the preacher, despite his advanced years, had given good account of himself. He fought his assailant, or perhaps two of them, probably for twenty minutes.

In that time the battle raged through the bedroom in which it started and an adjoining room. Furniture was overturned, chairs were upset, bed clothes pulled away, ornaments knocked to the floor and walls scarred as the thief swung his axe again and again and the doctor, with no weapon but his bare hands, grappled with him.

Three physicians who examined Dr. Kerr, and detectives who learned the extent of his injuries, were surprised that a man of his years had survived the encounter. His slowly oozing and there was hope that he would get well.

SWERVES TO DODGE ANOTHER CAR AND GOES INTO DITCH
Max Adelstein Pinned Under Steering Wheel of Auto and Killed.

Montreal, July 12.—One man was killed and two others were seriously injured at Lacolle last night, when an automobile in which they were driving overturned and they were thrown into a ditch. The driver of the car had swerved to avoid a collision.

Max Adelstein, twenty-seven, lived only a few minutes after the accident, being pinned under the steering wheel of the car.

Ben Joseph, thirty, of Notre Dame de Grace, suffered a fractured leg, and Phillip Joseph, twenty-eight, also of Notre Dame de Grace, sustained severe injuries to the abdomen. Both were taken to the hospital.
