Rates of Commission on Money Orders. The rates of commission on Money Orders issued by any Money Order Office in Newfoundland to the United States of America, the Dominion of Canada and any part of Newfoundland, are as follows: For sums not exceeding \$10 - 5 cts. Over \$10 but not exceeding \$20 - 10 cts. Over \$20 but not exceeding \$30 - 15 cts. Over \$30 but not exceeding \$40 - 20 cts. Over \$40 but not exceeding \$50 - 25 cts. Over \$50 but not exceeding \$60 - 30 cts. Over \$60 but not exceeding \$70 - 35 cts. Over \$70 but not exceeding \$80 - 40 cts. Over \$80 but not exceeding \$90 - 45 cts. Over \$90 but not exceeding \$100 - 50 cts.

Ottawa, Sept. 25.—The subscriptions to the Canadian War Loan, closed on Saturday, amount to a hundred and eighty millions.

German Air Raid

London, Sept. 25.—One German airship, and probably another, was brought down during a raid over the eastern counties of England and the outskirts of London last night. According to an official statement, one airship was brought down in the southern part of Essex. It is reported another fell on the Essex coast. The text follows:—

An attack by hostile airships was made in Lincolnshire and the eastern counties and on the outskirts of London. The latter attack was made about midnight, but was beaten off by our anti-aircraft defences. One airship was brought down in flames in the southern part of Essex.

A report has been received that another fell on the Essex coast, but the later report is hitherto unconfirmed. No reports of casualties or damage have yet been received. An official statement announcing the Zeppelin attack on London said:—

At 12.15 p.m., 14 or 15 airships participated in an attack on Britain last night; the southeastern, eastern and east midland counties and Lincolnshire were the principal localities visited. An attack on London was carried out by airships from the southeast between 1 and 2 a.m., and by one airship from the east between 12 and 1 a.m.

Aeroplanes were sent up and were opened from anti-aircraft defences, the raiders being driven off. Bombs were dropped, however, in the southern and southeastern districts, and it is regretted that 23 persons were killed and 99 injured.

Two of the raiders were brought down in Essex. They were both large airships of the new pattern. One of them fell in flames and was destroyed, together with its crew of 22 officers and men. The men of the second were captured.

Riley Was Sensitive

Why He Stopped Reciting One of His Poems in Public. 'As an illustration of Riley's sensitive nature,' said Melville E. Stone, 'Jim and I went alone to the theatre to see Sol Smith Russell, who also belonged to the Saints and Sinners' Corner. He was playing The Peer Relation. In the play was a scene where Russell took a young boy and put him in a barrel while he removed his trousers to mend them. The audience roared with laughter at the comic situation. Next to me in the box sat James Whitcomb Riley, sobbing as if his heart would break. He saw no humor in the plight of the little boy. To him it was pathetic.

'He, like Eugene Field, was felled to children. He loved them, but he loved them artistically. I am not sure that personally—that is, mind you, hanging to a man's coat-tails—they, either of them, wanted children around. They lacked the patience necessary for daily contact with children. Riley and Field could write heartbreaking verse in respect of morbid amount of human sympathy, but so far as I know this was at arm's length from the youngsters themselves, especially in Field's case. Riley was ever exceedingly sympathetic. One evening Jim was reciting his poem, 'A Happy Little Cripple,' before a large audience. He had scarcely begun the lines—

'I'm thist a little crippled boy an, never gon' to grow An' git a great big man at all 'cause aunty told me so. When I was thist a baby on't I falled out of the bed An' got 'the court'ure of the spine—' 'at's what the doctor said— when he noticed a man and a woman in the audience leaving the hall. He made inquiry and found out that they had a little lame child of their own much like the one he was describing. He resolved never to recite that poem in public again.'—New York Post.

PROCLAMATION

GEORGE the FIFTH, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

WHEREAS We deem it expedient and necessary to appoint Terms or Sessions for the holding of our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of Our Island of Newfoundland, at the several times and places hereinafter mentioned:

We do, therefore, declare to all our loving subjects in Our said Island that it is Our will and pleasure to direct and appoint it at Our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of Our said Island, shall be open and holden—

At Trinity, on Friday, the Fifteenth, and Saturday, the Sixteenth days of September next;

At Catalina, on Monday the Eighteenth day of September next;

At Bonavista, on Tuesday, the Nineteenth, and Wednesday, the Twentieth days of September next;

At Greenspond, on Thursday, the Twenty-first, Friday, the Twenty-second, and Saturday, the Twenty-third days of September next;

At Grand Falls, on Monday, the Twenty-fifth day of September next;

At Briggs, on Friday, the Seventeenth, and Saturday, the Eighteenth days of November next;

At Harbor Grace, on Monday, the Twentieth, Tuesday, the Twenty-first, Wednesday, the Twenty-second, and Thursday, the Twenty-third days of November next;

At Carbonear, on Friday, the Twenty-fourth, and Saturday, the Twenty-fifth days of November next.

And the said Court shall be kept open for the periods hereinbefore prescribed at each of the respective places, as aforesaid, provided the presiding Judge shall have business to do therein; and, if necessary, such Judge may extend the term at any of the said places for a period not exceeding two days, and until the determination of the trial or any case then proceeding.

And We do, by these presents, further order and direct that in the event of a Judge who may preside in the said Court in the Northern District of Our said Island being prevented by unavoidable circumstances from opening Our said Court on any of the days hereinafter appointed, or if the said Judge should arrive at any of the places hereinafter named for holding Our said Court before the time stated for the opening thereof, and shall deem it proper to open the same without delay, the said Judge may, and he is hereby authorized to open and hold Our said Court on any other day or days than those hereinbefore specified, and to keep the same open for the respective periods hereinbefore stated, as aforesaid, if he should find it necessary for the despatch of business to do so.

And of these Presents all Magistrates, the Sheriff, Officers of the Constabulary Force, and all Bailiffs, Constables, Keepers of Gaol, and all other officers in the execution of their offices about the premises, and all and singular other persons whom these Presents do, shall or may concern, are hereby required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Witness Our trusty and well-beloved Sir WALTER EDWARD DAVIDSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our said Island of Newfoundland and its Dependencies, at St. John's, in Our said Island, this 31st day of July, A. D. 1916, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.


