This Institution, founded in 1875, is directed by the Religious of Holy Cross, well known throughout Canada and the States for their educational establishments.

Farnham, is a junction place for many of the principal Railways of the province. This gives exceptional advantages for facility of communication with the great central places of Canada and the States.

Agreeably situated on the right bank of the Yamaska river on a beautiful site, and elevated ground, the establishment possesses large and commodious buildings, spacious play-grounds provided with all things necessary for the amusement of students.

The excellency of the studies pursued at this College seems to be sufficiently demonstrated by the establishment's rapid prosperity and the large number of its ALUMNI, now occupying the most prominent positions in Trade.

The aim of the Religious of Holy Cross, at Farnham as elsewhere, is to impart to their pupils an essentially Christian Education, as well as solid instruction.

The teachers endeavor first of all to inspire their students with an enlightened piety; to develop in them noble and generous sentiments, and to initiate them to habits of work, economy and politeness.

The course of studies, among which religious instruction stands pre-eminent, is purely commercial. It is given simultaneously in both languages, and generally comprises five years.

BUSINESS CLASS.

Students who have finished their 3rd year are admitted into this Class. It comprises a course of two years, and has for its object to give to the students a practical knowledge of business affairs. Actual business is also taught, such as buying and selling, manufacturing. banking and all commercial transactions. The faculty endeavors to make this class complete and profitable to the students. The class-room is large, and is fitted up in a banking house manner. Students are required to pass three examinations a year; and to receive their diplomas, they must have an average of at least threefourths of the points allowed; besides, they will be obliged to pass a satisfactory examination in French.
