New Bruswick and Nova Scotis Spruce and Pine Deals.-The arrivals during the past month, chiefly by the winter livers, have rgain been large, and in excess of the cerresponding period last year, viz., 2,710 standards, sgain t 2,400 standards in 1903; the deliveries have been fair, but stocks, although slightly less than the same month last season, are still large and, recent con ignments have been forced off at lower pr ces; contracting for next season is very quiet. Pine Deals, -The demand is slow.
