They do know what they are talking about." She touched on the shortage of labor on the farms and made an appeal for measures to cope with the situation. Mrs. Nellie McClung said things which struck deep into the hearts of her hearers. Cannot Blame Men Now. "In the old days we thought if we only had the vote everything would be all right," said Mrs. McClung. "Now it has come. Henceforth, if anything is wrong we can't blame the men. It will be our own fault." She made an appeal for teachers to go to Alberta, where 1,000 schools have to be closed owing to the shortage of instructors. She felt it a patriotic duty for any who could do so, to help in the matter. "Give up your knitting for awhile if you have to," she said. "When I'm just knitting I can't let myself into the idea that I'm doing my whole patriotic duty." Like Miss Saunders of the Y.W.C.A. Mrs. McClung appealed to the women to give emancipated and consecrated service to Canada.
