

Rev. H. C. Fraser For Knox Church

Unanimous Call Extended to Ex-Chaplain of Australian Forces Who Saw Much Service—Conducted Services Last Sunday.

At a meeting held in the Knox Presbyterian church, City road, last evening a unanimous call was extended to the Rev. H. Moorehouse Legate of Montreal to fill the pastorate of the church left vacant by the Rev. H. C. Fraser, who resigned last July. The Rev. F. S. Dewling, of St. Andrew's Presbyterian church has been filling the vacancy on different occasions and much credit is due him for the efforts made to keep the congregation of Knox church together until another pastor can be secured. It is expected that the Rev. Mr. Legate will accept the hearty invitation extended him, as he made many friends amongst the members of the congregation on his visit here last Sunday when he conducted the services in both the morning and at night.

Rev. Mr. Legate is at present living in Montreal where he has resided ever since returning from overseas where he seen much active service as chaplain to the Australian Light Horse Infantry. As yet he has not been extended a call from any other church in the Dominion, and the congregation of Knox church will consider themselves fortunate in procuring this able speaker and gentleman.

Mr. George Robertson, who acted as chairman at the meeting last evening, said that he expected an answer from the Rev. Mr. Legate either today or tomorrow.

The High School, as well as some of the other schools, have been unable to prepare their usual Christmas entertainment owing to the fact that the Assembly Hall has been used as a class room and rehearsals were therefore impossible. Prizes and medals will be presented in the Assembly Hall at eleven this morning, however, and the High School Cadets will give an exhibition of physical exercises. Sergeant Olive will be in command.

Medals to be presented and winners are: Corporation Gold Medal, highest standing in Grade XI, A. Oreta Lingley.

Governor General's Silver Medal, highest standing in Grade X, J. Reginald Lingley; 2nd prize, Edith MacRae.

Alumnus Gold Medal, highest standing in Grade IX, M. Roberta Smith, 2nd prize, C. Louise Bartsch.

Ellis Gold Medal, for best essay on "What We Owe the British Navy," Beatrice Cruikshank.

Fortnightly Prize of Books, highest marks in English literature, Marion Smith.

Parker Silver Medal, highest marks in mathematics, Grade XI, A. Oreta Lingley.

Ten Dollar Gold Piece presented by Alfred Morrissey in memory of his son, Lieut. Geo. Morrissey, awarded to Edith MacRae, Grade X.

Chairman Emery's Gold Medal, highest High School entrance, Walter Hughes.

Gershon Mayes Gold Medal, High School entrance, awarded Alice M. Fulton, Albert School.

Lieut. Governor's Silver Medal, highest standing for St. John county, High School entrance, Walter Hughes.

Winners of prizes offered by the I. O. D. E., for the best essays on the Navy, who are pupils at the High School will be presented with their awards.

Prominent citizens who will make the presentation of prizes are: Sir Douglas Hazen, Mayor Hayes, Canon Armstrong, Dr. Donald Malcolm, D. S. O., Chairman Emery and Doctor Bridges.

A tablet in memory of the High School boys who made the supreme sacrifice during the Great War has been presented to the school by the staff of the High School Herald, and will be unveiled in the Assembly Hall after the presentation of prizes. Fred McGovern, the Editor-in-Chief of the Herald for the year 1918-19, will present the tablet.

The tablet was secured through the efforts of Mr. McGovern and his assistant editors, Misses Dorothy Lee and May Jarvis, and was purchased from funds raised by the sale of the Herald.

The tablet is a most attractive one of brass, with red and black lettering and bears a facsimile of the pin of the 19 class, the whole being mounted on an oak shield. The panel is the work of G. Herbert Owen. It will be placed on the east wall of the Assembly Hall between the middle and east entrances.


