U. S. OFFICERS END

OF GERMAN ROGUE

Fools Berlin and Paris, But
Tries Dope Selling On
Americans.

EVEN DODGED ARMY

Poses as a Baron, Makes Im-
pression on Foch, Gets Red
Cross Money.

BERLIN, Feb. 3.—Another picture-
esque career of a rascal, which reads
as if it might have sprung from the
imagination of a novelist, has just come
to light here through the arrest of
Robert Oertel. Although only 26 years
old, Oertel put over schemes which
fairly take one's breath.

In the first place, to escape further
service in the army, he pretended that
he was insane. He played this part so
well that he was sent to a military
hospital, from which he deserted, and
went to the Red Cross there, and was
entrusted with large sums of money.

His next venture was to visit General
Mackensen, at that time a prisoner in
Hungary, and was entrusted with con-
fidential powers by the Czech-Slova-
kian Government. But finally he
"baron" got a little careless, and at-
tempted to carry out a cocaine deal.

It was an army official who
burst his bubble in Bismarck by dis-
covering that his passport was false.
Although his companion, the nurse,
was allowed to go free, the Americans turn-
ed the "baron" over to the Berlin police.

WAR IS REALITY
YET TO BRIDES

Thousands Wedded During
Days of Excitement Return
to Homes Sadder, Wiser.

DETROIT, Feb. 3.—In the lives of wo-
man-kind the war is by no means over,
according to Virginia May Murray,
general secretary of the Travelers' Aid
Society of New York City, who is in
Detroit to organize a policewomen's
club to the Detroit police depart-
ment.

During the war she was supervisor
of the section on women and girls of
the war work administration commis-
sion, and she has been in the
training camps, with ten southern
states in her territory, where she
supervised dance halls and looked after
the women who followed in the wake of
the army. She has been general sec-
retary of the Travelers' Aid Society in
New York since 1919.

Scores of war brides who came over
shortly after their soldier sweethearts
came back and were married with full
sanction of uniform and in the hectic
days of rejoicing are now passing
through the port of New York on their
way back to their hinterland, sadder
and wiser, and most of them with tiny
babies in their arms. Miss Murray
says, "And Miss Murray ought to know,
because her department cleared 8,000
women and children during December."

"Immigration cases constitute a good
proportion of our work," Miss Murray
says. "I have seen many of these girls
and women who have been separated
from their husbands for a long time,
