Has been on Commission of the Peace since 1836. Was first President of the Board of Police, Belleville: Reeve of Belleville; and Mayor of that town in 1866. Sat for Co. Hastings in Leg. Assembly, Can.. from 1847 to 1851, when he was defeated; and for Hastings, S. R. from 1854 to 1857. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Trent Division Leg. Coun. Can. in 1861. Represented that Division from 1863 until the Union. Appointed to Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—Belleville, Ont.

FOSTER, Lieut, Col. Hon. Asa Belknap, J. P. C.

Is Lieut. Col. commanding 1st Batt. Shefford Militia. Sat for Shefford in Leg. Assembly, Can., from 1858 until 1860, when he resigned, and was returned to Leg. Council for Bedford division, which he represented until the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—Frost Village, P. Q.
