NADEAU, MATHIAS, J.P. (Madawaska.)

Father, a descendant of a family which emigrated from the Province of Quebec; was one of the first settlers in the Parish of St. Hilaire, Co. of Madawaska. B. in St. Hilaire, 21st Feb. 1838. Ed. at Ste. Anne's Coll. M. at St. Hilaire, 16th Feb., 1862, Miss Saucier. Is a merchant and a farmer; a J.P., and has represented St. Francis in the County Council of Madawaska for six years. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at last g.e. First returned to Parlt., 7th Oct., 1882, by acclamation, on the resignation of the mem. elect. PALMER, ALBERT. (Queens.)

Ancestors were English, but came to N.B. from the States with the U.E. Loyalists. B. at Hampstead, N.B., and ed. there. M. at St. John, 26th March 1868, Miss Sheloa A. Durgan. Is a trader, and has been Warden of Queen's Co. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal. —Hampstead, N.B.

PARK, WILLIAM A. (Northumberland.)

Eldest s. of William Park, Esq., merchant, Newcastle, N.B. B. 27th June 1853. Ed. in Co. of Northumberland, N.B. Unmarried. Admitted as an Attorney, N.B., 23rd April 1875, and called to the Bar, N.B., 24th April 1876. Was Warden of the Co. of Northumberland in 1877. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative,—Newcastle, N.B.

PERLEY, Hon. WILLIAM E. (Sunbury.)

Was a mem of Ex. Council, without office, from 1862 to 1865. Again apptd. to same position, 28 Oct. 1874. Sat for present seat from 1854 until 1870, when defeated; again returned at g.e. 1874. An unsuccessful candidate for Sunbury in House of Commons at g.e. 1867, and again elected at g.e. 1874. Re-elected to Leg. at g.e. 1878 and again at last g.e. Apptd. mem. of Ex. Council, June 1878. A Liberal Conservative.—Blissville.

QUINTON, WILLIAM A. (St. John County.)

Is a farmer. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal.—Fairville, N.B.
