GORDON, ADAM. (North Ontario.)

Descended from and distantly related to the noble family of Huntley. S. of Wm. Gordon, formerly a merchant of Dundee and Forfar, Scot., who came to Canada, 1838, and settled at Bayside, Whitby, Ont., where he has since remained. B. in Forfar, 16 Sept., 1831. Ed. there and at Whitby. Was Deputy Reeve of Mariposa, 1864, and Deputy Reeve and Reeve of Reach, 1866 to 1872. A delegate to Prohibitory Convention, Montreal, 1875. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at last g.e. A Liberal, and a supporter of the Mackenzie Govt. In favor of Prohibition being left in abeyance until next general election.—Manchester, Ont
