
#### Ross Building

### Discover the Career & Placement Centre

The Career & Placement Centre offers campus career services in Canada in cooperation with the Canada Employment & Immigration Commission. The Centre remains available to you following graduation and throughout the summer. You are invited to become acquainted with the Centre by attending a free one hour daily Intake Counselling Session.

On-Call Individual Counselling is available to assist clients in learning how to deal with career and placement concerns. Career Planning, Vocational Testing, Employment Research and Job Search seminars are held regularly.

The Centre houses an extensive Resource Library which includes casual, part-time and full-time Job Listings; Alumni Placement Surveys; Career Development Video-tapes; Employer Information; Resumé Critique Service and Information Interview Job Search Network.

A variety of special projects are sponsored by the Centre, such as the On-Campus Recruitment Program which will arrange employer interviews for '87 and '88 graduates; Career Information Week; Summer Job Fair; Career Conversations featuring experts from the workplace and Graduate Students Career Services.

Staff at the Career & Placement Centre are professionals in their field. Despite revolutionary changes in the world of work, they know how to respond creatively to a number one priority at York -- the successful integration of graduates into the workforce.
