Camp Borden, Ont.	25-5-41		<p>Empire Day Protestant Church Service conducted by Sqn. Ldr. John McNab, Chaplain from No. 1 Training Command. Partly overcast and smoky from forest fires. Windy, increasing in afternoon to gusts in excess of 30 mp.h. Dual flying only in afternoon until 1530 hours when flying washed out. Protestant Church Parade at 1130 hours, with service in the Theatre. Flying resumed at 1900 hours practicing instrument take-offs. Night flying at Camp Borden from 2100 hours to 0500 hours. F/O I. Somerville, instructor "B", posted to No. 6 S.F.T.S. Dunnville, Ontario.</p>	
" "	26-5-41		<p>Average flying day. Drifting clouds with gusty wind. Air Vice Marshal S. J. Goble, Australian Liaison Officer, accompanied by Sqn. Ldr. J.R. Gordon visited the station in connection with personnel of courses.</p>	
" "	27-5-41		<p>Cloudy with considerable wind. Night flying washed out. Rained hard during the early part of the morning. Night flying cancelled on account of weather.</p>	
" "	28-5-41		<p>Fair morning with light haze. Cleared up to some extent in pm. but night flying washed out. Mr. Lyons of North American Aviation Co., California, visited station to obtain data re Harvards. Night flying washed out due to weather conditions.</p>	
" "	29-5-41		<p>Overcast and some smoke haze. Flying washed out in afternoon and night owing to painting of few lines on tarmac. F/O W.S.W. Breese, Administrative Officer, No. 2 Squadron, posted to Physical Training Course, Trenton, Ontario. P/O H.S. MacDonald assumed his duties. Hon. Air Commodore J.S. Duncan delivered address to the station personnel in the Drill Hall at 1330 hours on the Victory Loan.</p>
