  - "We would seek, in a word, trade with all nations of the world believing that only in that way we can bring about prosperity to this and all the nations of the world".
- At Wingham, Ont. August 14th, 1935

  As reported in Torento Clobe, August 15, 1935

  "The Liberal Farty would place compulsory regulations contained in the Marketing Act under the jurisdiction of Parliament and relieve Marketing Boards of any authority to regulate trade, fix prices, or punish violaters of the act."
- 7. At London, Ontario, August 15th, 1935 As reported in LONDON ADVERTISER, August 16, 1935
  - "If you want unemployment insurance, health insurance, and other social measures, I ask you to join with the Liberal Party in its effort to bring back our trade, to restore work on our railways and bring about improvement in business by trade expansion. Those are sound foundations that our house needs. When we have those we can go about to improve the upper part of the house. That is the way we will proceed, said Mr. King."
  - S. At Port Arthur, Ont. October 3, 1935 As reported in OTTAWA CITIZEN, OCTOBER 4, 1935
    - "A Liberal Government would deal with unemployment not by turning it over to one cabinet minister as Mr. Bennett had done, but by appointing a representative national commission to mobilize all forces and agencies in Canada which dould make a contribution."
- 9. At Barrie, Ont. OCTOBER 5, 1935
  As reported in TORONTO GLOBE, October 7th, 1935
  - 1. Promised to summon Dominion and Provincial conference for adoption of uniform measures throughout Canada dealing with serious financial problems of the country.
  - 2. Appoint a nation-wide commission to study and supervise grave problem of unemployment.
  - 3. Reduce the tariff: 4. Remove or reduce sales tax on many necessaries of life: 5. Extend British preference and seek a lowering of tariff barriers throughout the Empire: 6. Despatch trade missions to all the important countries of the world."
