Extract of letter addressed to the Prime Minister by P. A. Choquette. Quebec.

December 19th, 1939.

Your explanations regarding the erection of a statue in honour of Sir Arthur Doughty have given me much satisfaction especially as you have been good enough to take note of what the country owes to Sir Etienne-Pascal Tache.

I hope in the next estimates, instead of the millions which are being voted for war that \$20,000 or \$25,000 may be set aside for a monument to this great citizen. If I am not mistaken, he would be only the second French Canadian to have a monument on Parliament Hill. As the proverb says "All's well that ends well".
