Referring to your letter of the 14th instant, I beg to inform you that the supplies shipped to you in December last will cost as follows:-

The difference in the price of the rice is due to the fact that only 200 lbs. had been provided for under contract at 4½ ¢ per lb., and in order to meet your request for 400 lbs. the Department had to purchase 200 lbs. extra and the rate was 5 ¢ per lb.
