Dear Madam,-

I beg to acknowledge your letter of the 1st inst, with reference to the sale of your property to Michall Simon, the contents of which have been noted.

It may be that the purchaser is unable to pay you at present all that is due under this agreement, but he should pay you something. You had better see him again when you go to St. Regis. If he is unable to pay you any thing on account he should be willing to allow you to have the use of the property for a sufficient length of time to satisfy the balance of your claim, or he should, if you are willing, cancel the agreement and give you possession of the land on your returning to him what he has paid on the purchase price after you deduct whatever amount would be a reasonable rent. If the purchaser refuses to do anything or to give you possession you had better communicate with the agent who may be able to get an adjustment of the matter.
