I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 20th ultimo, with which you submitted reports for the months of August, September, and October, from Miss Lizzie Flett, Field Matron, at Split Lake Reserve; and in reply I beg to say that the said reports indicate on the whole a satisfactory condition of affairs on the reserve.

It is hoped that the Indians will live under more sanitary conditions this winter than during previous winters consequent upon the new houses which Miss Flett has stated were built in July last, and which will result in the old homes being less crowded.

It is observed that while there was a certain amount of illness upon the reserve during August, the health of the Indians in general has been fair since that time, and it is hoped that Miss Flet as hitherto, will be active in the discharge of her duties in caring for the sick during the winter should illness occur in any of the families.

It is pleasing that up to the end of October Miss Flett had not been called upon to give much assistance in the way of food to an of the Indians.
