

Ottawa, 2nd December, 1919.

Sir,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th ultimo, enclosing a paper writing purporting to be the will of the late Stephen Laroné. Before this will can be approved two affidavits will be required, one as to the death of the deceased and the other by the witness to the will. I am enclosing the forms which you will be good enough to have properly filled out and sworn to. I am enclosing the will to be identified by the witness and you will kindly return it with the affidavits. It is inferred from this will that Wellington Charles and his wife cared for the deceased for a period of four years or more previous to his death. Will you say when forwarding the will whether this was the case.
