

as Chairman. The Government has accepted this plan and has agreed to supply at once the funds required to rehabilitate the station. The power now stands at 500 watts, but as there is a wide-spread demand from both the men's and women's farm organizations for improved service we should like to raise the power to 1,000 watts which should tend to give us larger coverage. There is no proposal to change name or designation.

May I add that the plan I have just described is similar to that in successful operation in the case of the University of Alberta Hospital, which is jointly controlled by the Government and the University. I have been a member of the Hospital Board for many years and I can assure you that its business is carried on in a completely impartial and non-partizan spirit. I have every confidence that the same remark would be true of the conduct of the University radio.

The University Board of Governors, whose Chairman is the Hon. Chief Justice Horace Harvey, are cordially in favour of the arrangement proposed and trust that there will be no difficulties from the point of view of the CBC in its immediate adoption."
