

tion is payable, may be considered a supernumerary member, and be exempted from the subscription during the continuance of such absence ; but any member availing himself of this indulgence must notify the same by letter to the Secretary, who shall insert his name in the Book of Supernumerary Members. Any such member shall be re-admitted to all his privileges, upon his return being notified, in writing, to the Secretary, and such notification to be given within one month of his return to Canada, and upon payment of his subscription for the current year ; and failing in such notification and payment, such member shall be considered as having withdrawn himself from the Club.

XI.—Officers in Her Majesty's Army and Navy, and persons holding military and civil appointments under the Imperial Government, who may be stationed in Canada temporarily, shall be admitted to the privileges of the Club on payment of the subscription semi-annually in advance.

XII.—Any member shall have the privilege of introducing a friend to breakfast, lunch or dinner, at his sole expense, provided the name of such friend shall have been previously inscribed on the book to be kept for that purpose.

XIII.—Any member whose dues are all paid shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club, on his written application to that effect, sent to the Committee before the first stated Annual Meeting of the Club, to be held on the first Thursday in December.
