better to err in the opposite extreme. If any are disposed to think I have carried my endeavours after simplicity too far, and are desirous of something more elaborate, I refer them to the excellent work of Dr. Henry, of Charleston, entitled, "Letters to a Friend," recommended by Dr. Pye Smith, the object of which is precisely the same as my own, but which is written in a more diffuse style, and illustrated by a greater variety of facts.
