For the information of Travellers between Windsor and Parrborough, &c.

THE Parrborough packet sails regularly between Windsor and Parrborough twice in every week, and occasionally three times; but always from Parrborough every Monday in the Summer season, wind and weather permitting, so as to be at Windsor on Tuesday, and will sail from thence the first high water that happens, at or after 8 o'clock in the forenoon of that day.—The passage money for each person is five shillings, and the freight for horses and neat cattle, is seven shillings and six-pence per head. The vessel is 42 tons burthen, and has good accommodations for passengers; and likewise for taking over horses, neat cattle, sheep, &c.
