August.—The dispute respecting the proper time for sowing grass and clover ought to have been settled by this time. It would have been, but for the fact that there are many who would rather experiment than accept the facts of long experience. They then say experience has taught me that seeding on spring grain is very unreliable for clover. Well, but that was known fifty years ago, and why experiment about it. On lands where winter grain can be grown, and you desire to raise clover there, be sure you sow your clover seed at the same time. As to grasses as a general rule they should be sown in the fall. This is the established practice in England, and the same is followed by the best practical farmers on this continent. Canadian farmers cannot far err in following these examples.
