(4) "Canadian Baptist" and Book Room.

Resolved, That we gratefully record our appreciation of the services rendered to our church and home life by the "Canadian Baptist" and Book Room, and would earnestly urge that a yet deeper interest be taken in both of these departments of our publication work, in order that their usefulness may reach out to every corner of our land. Carried.

(5) Temperance.

Moved by Rev. D. Hutchinson, seconded by Rev. T. S. Johnson,

Whereas, we, as a denomination, have always expressed ourselves as strongly in favor of a prohibition liquor law, and whereas it is now possible that some monetary or other consideration may be attached to the coming plebiscite;

Be it resolved, That we earnestly urge upon all the members of our churches the importance of supporting the vote for prohibition in the face of whatever conditions may be attached. Carried.

In connection with this resolution, Mrs. M. R. Thornley, President of the Provincial W. C. T. U., and Mrs. Jennie McArthur, Treasurer of the same, were introduced, and spoke a few words to the body.

The resolution *re* Temperance was referred back to the Committee for amendment.

(6) Resolution *re* sermons in November.

Whereas, the last Sunday in November has been adopted as Temperance Day in England and the United States, and whereas an effort is being made to secure united action throughout the world to make this day tell in the interests of temperance, therefore,

Resolved, That we suggest to the pastors of our churches the advisability of preaching a sermon on this day bearing directly on the liquor traffic. Carried.

(7) By request of the Dominion Alliance the following were appointed to represent the body at its sessions in Toronto:

Resolved, That Rev. C. A. Eaton, of Toronto, Rev. Ira Smith, of London, Mr. D. Bentley, of Montreal, and T. D. Craig, M.P., of Port Hope, be appointed members of the Committee of the Dominion Alliance, to take part in the meeting to be held in Toronto on July 14, in accordance with the request named above. Carried.
