Sago Jelly.—Boil a teacupful of sago in three and a half pints of water till done; when cold, add half a pint of raspberry syrup; put it into a shape which has been rinsed in cold water; when turned out into the dish, pour a little cream round it.

Soda Cake.-Half a pound of butter, half a pound of flour, three-quarters soda Cake.—Han a pound of outer, nan a pound of nour, three-quarters of a pound of loaf-sugar, four eggs, one teaspoonful of Soda, and the rind of one lemon, grated. Beat the eggs for twenty minutes, the yelks and whites separately, melt the butter, and add the ingredients to it separately, beating them all the time. Bake for two and a half hours in a moderate oven.

Delicious Dish of Apples.—Take two pounds of apples, pare and core them, slice them into a pan; add one pound of loaf-sugar, the juice of three lemons, and the grated rind of one. Let these boil about two hours. Turn it into a mould, and serve it with thick custard or cream.
