ARTHUR, ONT.—It is probable that
an addition will be built to the High
school.

PINE, ONT.—The Pine Lumber Com-
pany purpose installing additional power
in their saw mill.

HOPEWELL HILL, N. B.—The
Church of England will shortly build a
new church here.

TILBURY, ONT.—Miss Sarah Gahan,
of Tilbury North, intends building on a
lot on Cathcart street.

TRURO, N.S.—The Town Council
will engage an engineer to report on a
waterworks system.

CALENDAR, ONT.—The Tema-
gami Lumber Company are building a
large saw mill here.

NORTH SYDNEY, N. S.—A com-
pany is being formed here for the purpose
of building a new rink.

PORT HOPE, ONT.—The Britanna
Paper Company will build a paper mill
here to cost about \$50,000.

PETROLEA, ONT.—The Council
will likely issue \$17,000 of debentures for
erection of a central school.

PHENIX, B.C.—Richard Armstrong

is working on a plan to erect a concentra-
tor in the Boundary district.

SASKATOON, N.W.T.—Hoge &
Thompson have asked the Council for a
franchise for electric lighting.

WINDSOR MILLS, QUE.—J. R.
Hebert is talking of building a two storey
summer hotel on Coney Island.

PEMBROKE, ONT.—The Town
Council are receiving tenders on pur-
chase of about \$34,000 of debentures.

CHIPPEWA, ONT.—The construc-
tion of a system of waterworks, to cost
about \$25,000, is under consideration.

SHERBROOKE, QUE.—The Cana-
dian Rand Drill Company contemplate
building a large addition to their works.

WOODSTOCK, ONT.—The Canadian
Bank of Commerce have decided to put
in the foundation for their new building
this fall.

WEST SHEFFORD, QUE.—Louis
Gauthier has been granted a franchise
for the construction of a waterworks sys-
tem here.

REVELSTOKE, B. C.—The Bow-
man Lumber Company intend making
extensive improvements to their saw mill
at Comaplix.

COLLINGWOOD, ONT.—The Col-
lingwood Furniture Company purpose
erecting new buildings and making other
improvements.

PETERBORO, ONT.—The Peterboro
Canoe Company are about to erect a
three-storey factory addition, 125 x 25
feet, cost \$4,000.

LONDON, ONT.—The Southwestern
Traction Company will shortly start the
surveys for an electric railway from this
city to Hamilton.

WELLAND, ONT.—The Council will
construct a ten inch water main to the
Cordage Company's works, at an esti-
mated cost of \$9,000.

NORTH BAY, ONT.—A proposi-
tion has been submitted to the Town
Council to erect a smelter here. John
Ferguson is interested.

FERNIE, B.C.—It is understood that
the Elk Lumber & Manufacturing Com-
pany have decided upon the plans for
their proposed saw mill.

PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE, MAN.—
John P. O'Leary, architect, has just taken
tenders on the steam heating and plumb-
ing of the Merchants' Hotel.

ST. BONIFACE, MAN.—The Do-
minion Government have purchased
property on south side of Provencher
avenue as a site for new post office.

RAINY RIVER, ONT.—The Town
Council are endeavoring to secure con-
trol of the river front for the purpose of
building a power house, docks, etc.

FONTHILL, ONT.—The Imperial
Bank of Canada have purchased a site on

corner of Front and South Pelham streets
on which to erect an office building.

KINCARDINE, ONT.—The pros-
pects are that C. P. R. will next spring
complete the road from Teeswater to this
town and connecting with Walkerton.

EAST TORONTO, ONT.—It is es-
timated that the proposed High school
will cost \$20,000 and the Council will be
asked to issue debentures for this sum.

TORONTO JUNCTION, ONT.—The
Canada Cycle & Motor Company have
started work on the erection of a brick
building for the manufacture of automob-
iles.

CRANBROOK, B.C.—Chicago capi-
talists have been examining the Bull
River Power Company's works with a
view of carrying the enterprise to com-
pletion.

SYDNEY, N. S.—The Harris Abat-
toir Company, of Toronto, have purchas-
ed a block of land between Pitt and
Prince streets, presumably for building
purposes.

BOUCK'S HILL, ONT.—George
Lane, Township Clerk, is asking for bids
by November 25th for purchase of ten
debentures of \$864.62 each, bearing 4½
per cent. interest.

BRANTFORD, ONT.—A scheme is
on foot to erect a modern hotel facing the
new G. T. R. station. The name of Simon
James is mentioned in connection with
the project.

CHILLIWACK, B.C.—The Elk Creek
Water Company has been organized here,
to construct a waterworks system. The
Canadian Pipe Company, Vancouver, are
behind the project.

NEW GLASGOW, N. S.—Tenders
are requested by the Department of Rail-
ways and Canals, Ottawa, by Monday,
6th inst., for construction of an addition
to freight shed, a loading platform and a
crane at this place.
