

One hundred pounds of fodder corn will contain 57.8 bs. of dry matter, 2.5 lbs. of protein 34.6 lbs. of carbohydrates, and 1.2 lbs of fat. One hundred pounds of timothhay will contain, on the average, 86.8 lbs. dry matter, 2.8 lbs. protein, 42.4 lbs. carbohydrates, and 1.3 lbs. of fat has a slight advantage over fodder corn periments, yet investigators usually place when it comes to feeding.
