The Deputation being admitted, brought up for the concurrence of this House, a Bill, entitled, "An Act to provide for the Naturalization of such persons, resident in this Province at the period therein mentioned, as may not now be enabled by Law to be regarded as Natural Born Subjects of His Majesty." Naturalization Bill brought up.

The Deputation having withdrawn, the Message relative to the Gaol Limits Bill, was read as follows:—
