The Committee of this House appointed to hold a Report from the Conference with a Committee of Council, on the fub- Committee of Conject Matter of the Bill for a Tax upon Lands, reported from the faid joint Committee, that it had been proposed by the Committee of Council, to exempt from the Tax laid by the faid Act, certain Townships which are under particular Circumstances, and the House having taken the fame into Confideration,

Resolv'd, That this House do not agree to any such Exemption.

Resolution thereon,

Upon a Motion, Refolved, that a Conference with Conference defired with the Council. His Majesty's Council be desired by Committee on the great inconveniences which the feveral Settlements in this Province labour under by not having a Sheriff in each County.

Order'd, That a Message be sent to His Majesty's Council accordingly.

Then the House adjourn'd till To-morrow Morning Eleven o'Clock.

Friday, June 22, 1770.

His Majesty's Council sent down the Bill for grant-ing to His Majesty a Tax upon certain Lands granted Lands fent down not agreed to. within the Province of Nova-Scotia.

Not agreed to.

A Message came from His Majesty's Council, that they had appointed a Committee to confer with a Committee of this House on the Subject proposed Yesterday.

And a Committee was appointed for that Purpose.

Then the House adjourn'd till Tomorrow Morning Nine o'Clock.
