

TALLY ANOTHER SCORE

The exclusive announcement in the Courier of Saturday that the Ontario Government would devote \$10,000 for the further consideration of Grand River flood conditions, and the publication of a preliminary report by an engineer, naturally aroused not only general attention, but also great satisfaction.

The Grand is the most unruly of the many streams which overflow their banks in the Spring, and as it seems a very important industrial district between Galt and Danville, preventative measures are very properly to be first considered in its regard.

Mr. W. S. Brewster, M.P.P. and Mr. Westbrook, M.P., have both worked hard along with others, to bring this matter to a successful issue.

The four Conservative members of the four Brants certainly know how to look after the just interests and requests of their constituents.

A GOOD SHOWING.

The Ontario Bureau of Labor report just issued, gives statistics of the number of new buildings in the various municipalities and their cost during the year 1911. Brantford usually heads the list of the smaller cities in Ontario. Here is the record:

Table with 3 columns: Municipality, No. of New Aggregations, Buildings Erected, Cost. Brantford: 531, \$613,864. Bellefleur: 65, \$300,000. Berlin: 197, \$364,692. Stratford: 50, \$100,000. Guelph: 106, \$513,699. Woodstock: 20, \$200,000. St. Catharines: 134, \$280,438. Kingston: 52, \$151,233. St. Thomas: 146, \$283,511.

It will be noticed the only place to approach Brantford in total value was Guelph where they had heavy public building expenditures.

The real significance is in the number of permits. Here is the standing:- Total for the eight other cities, 777. Total for Brantford alone, 531.

The story thus told is that of the erection of a large number of new houses, many of them owned by the men of the factories.

There can be no better guarantee than this for the stability of any community.

A gentleman from the States interested in manufacturing after a recent tour of the city said to a Courier man: "Do you know that one of the biggest assets Brantford possesses is the number of pretty houses you have pointed out to me as owned by workers in the factories. If my concern had thoughts of putting a branch in Canada, that is one of the first things I would consider in favor of your city and I know that other employers of labor feel the same way. Your industrial board, if you have one, ought to push that feature for all it is worth, and it's worth a lot."
