



A SKIM MILK VARIETY. Most of our dairy farmers are well accustomed to hear of milk "testing" so much, either high or low, understanding thereby that it contains a certain per-centage. What is not quite so clear to the majority, is fact that milk varies consider-ably in its test, or contents of fat, from day to day, even from one milking to another on the same day, and from month to nonth. This applies to mixed herd milk and more particularly to milk from single cows. Thus, if milk is valued accord-ing to its fat contents, it is evi-every dary farmer to know what the milk does test; further he needs to know, whether sell-ing cream or pooling milk, if Blossom's milk tests 3.1 or 5.2 per cent of fat.
