Of him it may be rightly said that he was without reproach in his personal and public relations, that he was loyal and true to high ideals of personal conduct, and his untimely death will be mourned by all sections of the community in which he was so worthily honored, and particularly in the home town where many friends hold his memory dear.

The government, through the office of the Prime Minister, paid the following tribute to the late Dr. Edward Blackadder, M. P.:

"For some time past it has been apparent to his friends that Dr. Blackadder was in failing health. The news of his death is therefore not wholly unexpected. It comes nevertheless, as an occasion for real sorrow to all who knew him. The most modest of men, Dr. Blackadder was also one of the most cultured. His generous sympathies and unselfish devotion to interests other than his own long since established him in the affections of his fellow-citizens. He possessed a wide range of knowledge and experience and rare literary gifts. They have been used for years in an unflinching support of Liberal principles and policies. Few public men in a brief career have enjoyed activities as many sided. He was a practising physician, an editorial writer, a university lecturer and a representative of the people in Parliament. Throughout the last session, which was his first in the House of Commons, one of the most touching incidents was the fidelity with which, notwithstanding his all too evident infirmity, he attended the several sittings and sought to further in every way within his power the interests of his constituents. At all times unassuming, intensely earnest and sincere, his was a type which Parliament and the country at large can ill afford to lose."
