Terrible in the Southern States. In the days before the abolition of slavery we were accustomed to hear all sorts of reports about the undue influence exercised by the Democrats in the South in favor of their special platform and special candidates.

With the emancipation of the slave, and the subjugation of the South after its gallant struggle with the North, it was supposed that this antagonism of races would cease, but it seems to have been revived and intensified in the South last fall.

Our readers will scarcely believe that such a system of terrorism is being exercised in the Southern States to-day. Yet so it is, and as an evidence of it we copy the following from a private letter recently written by a lady now living in Louisiana to her friends in New England, and which was published in the New York Tribune.

I am twenty years older than when I last wrote, and died a thousand deaths in the last two months from terror for the fate of my husband and the boys—not on account of the epidemic; it ceased to be a topic when the career of crime commenced.

In Morehouse Parish was shot by a colored man, a white man named Allen, one of a gang who went at night to do some whipping. Several houses were visited and the occupants whipped, but they came finally to a house that did not answer to their demands.

The resumption of specie payments which was adopted on New Year's day, after a lapse of seventeen years, was brought about without any excitement. The Sub-Treasury in New York was prepared to meet the probable rush for gold; but the demand was very light, while in many instances greenbacks were preferred.

The champion of economy, the Hon. Hector Langevin, in addition to the usual private secretary, employs a French secretary, at an annual salary of \$1,700.

The American system of dismissals has been extended by Hon. Mr. Langevin, Postmaster-General, to branch post-offices. Mr. H. L. Loucks, a Reform postmaster at Hull, has been removed, and Mr. J. H. Kerr, a Conservative, appointed to the vacancy.

Le Canadien, the organ, we understand, of no less dominant a personage than Mr. Languevin, threatens that if Mr. Letellier is not dismissed "the star-spangled flag will float above the bastions of the promontory of Quebec if the Imperial authorities refuse to treat us as British subjects should be treated."
