THE MODERN MOTORMAN.

Who Personifies the Difference Between Old Ways and New.

He was an able citizen in his way, the old time horse car driver, and picturesque withal in his more or less negligee outfit. He could drive horses all right; he could get through where any man could if he was running on tracks; and standing there on the platform with the lines in one hand and the other resting on the brake and holding a whistle between his teeth on occasion, and wearing in winter an ulster of marvellous color and construction, and in summer something less, he was at all times a man to command our respect and admiration.
