NO SHORTAGE OF CATHOLIC

Director-Secretary of the Centre Disork done at Mount Cashel In- trict of the Catholic School Commis sion says that at the end of June, four thousand (4,000) applications for positions were received. Probably not fifty of that number received positions. If each of the other three districts received only 200 applications, it goes to show that the profession is becoming very popular in this big and growing city, and the salaries are not only up to the standard, but far above the average paid in leading commercial and industrial centres. A minimum salary of \$900 with yearly increases of \$100, and a maximum of \$2,500 to \$3,000, with a pension of \$1,000 or \$1,200 after 25 years of service, seem to be a decent living wage, and quite an attraction for young teachers who can make a success of the profession.

> WANT CHEAPER SCHOOL BOOKS. The price of school books is very dear, and where there are three or four children fom the same family, the cost amounts to sometimes over \$20. A movement is on foot to have cheaper books in the protestant Schools, as many parents are too poor to pay a big price for the books. The Department of Public Instruction at Quebec will consider the question at its next meeting, and make recommendations to the Government officials who promised to give the matter their "careful consideration." With good schools, efficient teachers, and books at a low figure, every boy and girl will start with the same advantages. After that it's up to them to make the best of their school days.

THE TOLL OF LIFE IS STILL

The automobile to-day is the greatest factor in the loss of hundreds of human lives. The majority of the accidents by the careless manipulation of the machines, especially with the mania for speed, together with the fact that so many drivers think that they can beat the oncoming train by taking a chance. Then there are others, who are not careful at curves. In five accidents reported in one day, all took place at curves, plus too much speed as the dominating factor.
