

FATHER TURQUETIL AND ANDRE'S BALLOON

Says Stories of Stranded Gas Bag in North Were Exaggerated.

[By Canadian Press.] Prince Albert, Sask., Feb. 1.—Rev. Father Turquetil, of Redemptor Lake, one of the famous missionaries of the far north, has reached Prince Albert after a journey which occupied 21 days. He reached the railway at Le Pas. An incident in his career is that he was the man who gave the world the strange story which about a year ago caused such a commotion all over the world. It was the report that while on a trip three hundred miles north of Redemptor Lake he had heard from natives that an enormous white ship had come down out of the clouds and that two men who were in it had been killed. He had reported this story to Bishop Pasquet at Prince Albert, and the latter had told it to the rest of the world. The conclusion reached at the time was that it must be the ill-fated airship balloon, and Father Turquetil had received many letters from all parts of Europe asking for particulars of the event. Father Turquetil says that the stories were much exaggerated and that he has been unable since to confirm by tangible proof the narrative. He said that he had seen the natives who had been trading with the northern Eskimos. He stated that the story had been very severe in the north and that he had a most difficult journey on dog trails.

This section was added to the hydro-electric power commission act last session. The legislation was put through the House by Hon. Adam Beck himself.

Now this power is taken away from Mr. Beck's board, to be given to that presided over by Mr. James Leitch. This section does not refer to rates, and in that connection the report is wide of the mark.

Another Aspect. There is another important aspect of the question, however. It is pointed out that the hydro-electric commission has fixed a standard equipment for the municipalities. What is now to hinder private corporations, such as the Toronto Electric Light Company or the London Electric Company, from taking objection to the municipal plants? The matter would then have to be referred to the court.

In Ottawa, the municipally-owned electric plant made a surplus of \$20,000, which was the result of reducing the cost of power to consumers, but the private companies are objecting all through the province.
