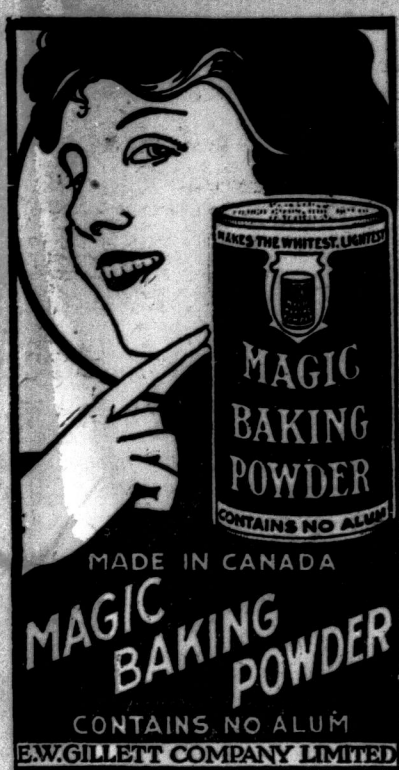




SASKATCHEWAN WHEAT

SEVEN-YEAR-OLD BOY BRITAIN MURDERED

New York Police Expect the Early Arrest of the Person Who Strangled Youngster.

Windham, N. Y., Aug. 30.—Arrests are expected today in the murder of 7-year-old Howard Rothenberg, whose body was found near a lake, his hands tied behind his back, a gag in his mouth, and a napkin twisted around his neck. The child was strangled.

The napkin used in the murder has been identified, according to Constable Harry Turk, who conducted the investigation. The perpetrator of the crime will be arrested before tonight, he said.

Little Howard had been spending his vacation at Windham, accompanied by his mother and sisters. His home is in Newark, N. J., where the boy will be taken.

Early yesterday he went fishing to try out a new rod his father had just sent him. When he did not return a general alarm was given and search begun. Late yesterday his body was found about 25 feet from a pool of water. Scratches and stains indicated that the body had been dragged some distance.

MAY CONTINUE CREDITS TO AID YOUNG FARMER

Ferguson Cabinet Investigates Present System of Rural Assistance.

Toronto, Aug. 30.—"We may continue rural credits as such a way as to help the young man with agricultural experience to acquire a farm of his own," said one of the ministers of the Ferguson government to The Advertiser today.

The whole question of continuing the system is being looked into thoroughly, and we have reached no decision yet.

The province has loaned more than four million dollars to more than 1,000 farmers on long-term loans during the last year and a half. About \$300,000 has been advanced in short-term loans. So far about 95 per cent of all payments have been met.

The system is showing a deficit of about \$100,000 per year, but it is expected within three years.

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Specialist in Foods Gives Advice Regarding Oysters

Oysters stand shipping very well as they remain edible for a period of from eight to ten days even when shelled, if they are kept at a low temperature. They will keep even longer and more satisfactorily if they are removed from their liquor. Shucked oysters are usually washed carefully in a number of waters and are then packed in air-tight receptacles which are surrounded with ice. They must not, under any circumstances, become frozen, although the old custom was to ship them floating in a tub with a cake of ice. This practice is no longer prevalent because of the menace to the oysters caused by melting ice.

Different opinions prevail regarding the digestibility of the oyster, although even delicate stomachs tolerate them quite frequently without

discomfort, so it may therefore be concluded that their assimilation is not markedly difficult. To certain individuals, however, the oyster is repellant, and a brief description of their construction and composition may be of interest. First, there is the liver which in this animal is a very bulky organ and which constitutes the fleshy part; then we find a single adductor muscle which closes the valves of the shell; next to this muscle is the "mantle," which contains the "gills" or "beard." The gills really form the outer part, being slightly fringed in appearance, and they furnish the test as to when the oyster is cooked. Most folks eat the entire animal, while very dainty persons remove the outer fringed portion.

Used Universally.
Because they lend themselves to so many ways of preparation, oysters are almost universally used, and they appear on the menus of the most exclusive as well as the cheapest restaurants and hotels. They are especially relished by invalids and children. Langworthy gives their composition as follows: 88.3 per cent water; 6.1 per cent nitrogenous matter; 1.4 per cent fat; 1.9 per cent salts and 2.3 per cent glycogen. One dozen oysters contain only about an ounce of solid matter so they therefore contain nutriment in a very diluted form and are not considered an economic food, but their use is undoubtedly healthful and affords variety in a dietary. The total solids are about equal in amount to those of milk, but a quart of oysters shucked costs from four to five times as much as a quart of milk. Oysters, like other bulky food, are of the amount of nutriment which they contain and they are the two animal foods which are exceptional in furnishing large amounts of carbohydrate, although not in the same form.

Look For Good Color.
When buying oysters in the shell, the shells should be very tightly closed and the oysters should have a good characteristic odor. They should ask to have one opened and it should not have a "ropy" or slimy appearance and should be of good color. Their appearance as well as their odor should also be carefully noted if oysters which have been opened are purchased and they should be in their own natural liquor without the addition of any water. Oysters should be eaten as soon as they have been removed from the shells and the practice of opening them and keeping them in tubs until purchased is to be deplored; this is because of the ease with which they transmit disease germs.

Oysters are most easily digested when eaten raw, as cooking in any form, whether boiling, scalding or stewing, coagulates and hardens them, thereby rendering them more difficult of solution in the stomach. In cooking them, when the shells begin to separate, somewhat resembling the partly opened pages of a book and become slightly filled or puffed at the edges, they should be removed from the fire. The application of heat prolonged much beyond this stage injures both their flavor and consistency.

Camp Corn or Indian Meal Bread.
Mix together and sift three cups of yellow corn meal (which is the same as maize or Indian meal), one cup of flour, one tablespoonful of granulated sugar, one teaspoonful of salt and three heaping teaspoons of baking powder. Work in a cupful of lard, cold. Add enough cold water or milk to make a stiff dough. Form into balls as big as hen's eggs, roll in flour and bake in the hot ashes of the fire, which should completely cover the bread. This will bake sufficiently in from fifteen to twenty minutes.

Biscuits.
Mix and sift one quart of flour, two heaping tablespoons of baking powder and one teaspoonful of salt. Rub into the flour dry two tablespoons of butter, lard or any kind of sweet fat. Add cold water enough to make a stiff dough. Roll it on a well-floured breadboard into a sheet an inch thick, cut into biscuits with an empty baking powder tin, bake in a greased pan in a hot oven ten or fifteen minutes.

Ginger Bread.
Mix together one cup of molasses, one tablespoonful of ground ginger, half a teaspoonful of salt, half a cup of melted butter or drippings, a cup of milk and three cups of flour, mixed with two teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Bake in gem pans in a moderate oven for half an hour.

prunes and other fruit are now prepared in excellent form, and with care will keep for years. Wash and soak over night in cold water, simmer in the same water until tender. Do not boil. Sweeten to taste and serve. If a pie is wanted take the fruit cooked as described, make a baking powder pie crust. Line a pie dish with it, pour in the fruit and cover with the pie crust. Bake until the crust is cooked. This recipe will answer for every variety of fruit, whether steamed or evaporated fruit in the market. Soak the fruit in cold water over night, simmer gently, but do not boil.
