Reciprecity Proposition.

Washington, March 1.—Mr. Castle, of Minnesota, by request, introduced a joint resolution for renewing the Reciprocity Treaty with the Dominion of Canada. The resolution provides for a treaty similar to that made by the United States and Great Britain, signed June 5, 1851, which continued in force ten years, concerning our trade and business relations with the Dominion of Canada. It is to avoid misunderstanding between the respective citizens and subjects in regard to the extent of the right of fishing on the coast of British North America, secured to each by Article 1 of a convention between the United States and Great Britain, signed at London, October 20, 1881, and is also designed to regulate the commerce and navigation between the respective territories and people, and more especially between Her Majesty's possessions in North America and the United States, in such a manner as to render the same reciprocity beneficial and satisfactory.

The Silver Question.

Washington, Feb. 29.—The Indian questions by the U. S. Supreme Court close by the United States over Behring Sea, was decided by the United States supreme Court this afternoon, against the British Government. This does not invalidate the arbitration negotiations now going on between this country and Great Britain, but it would have had its effect against the United States in the negotiations if the court had rendered a different decision. The court also decided the case of the schooner Sylvia Handy, involving points nearly similar, in favor of the United States. Justice Field was the only member of the court dissenting. The writ of prohibition asked for in the case was whether Behring Sea was an open or closed sea or body of water.
