## BOY'S STRANGE TALE O WOODS

Indian of Nine Makes Bow and Arrows—Lives Off Country  
Sackatoon, Oct. 6.—After 17 days of wandering alone in the wilderness around The Pas, Man., George MacLeod, a nine-year-old Indian boy, was yesterday found unharmed. Except for a quantity of matches he had no supplies with him in the 100 or more miles of his travels, but, according to him, he made himself a bow and arrow and lived off the country.  
Seventeen days previous the child ran away from McKay boarding school at the Big Eddy, six miles from The Pas. He was found at Sturgeon Landing to reach there he would have to make his way through bush and around deep bays, and cover a distance of at least 100 miles.  
In an interview he stated that he had made himself a bow and arrow, with which he had killed rabbits, chickens and other small game. He had found no difficulty in catching all the fish he wanted, and once got away unscathed with two large haddock from a trapper's cabin.  
Old timers at The Pas experienced in hiding out the boy through a cross-examination and had to admit the youngest possessed a natural sense of direction and resourcefulness without equal so far as their memory goes.

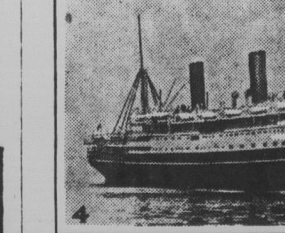
Gun Accidentally Discharged While Men Were Changing Seats

Mr. Matthews is the first victim of the hunting season in this province.



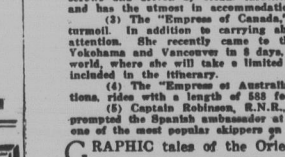

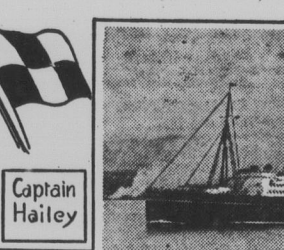
(1) Captain A. J. Hailey, R.N.R., commander of the "Empress of Canada," was born at Bedford in 1874. In 1906 he joined the Canadian Pacific, and in 1910 received his first command, the "Empress of India." His appointment to the "Canada" dates back to the launching of the liner. His last assignment was the command of the liner "Empress of Australia," which he held for two years.  
(2) The "Empress of Russia" was built by the Fairfield Shipbuilding and Engineering Co., Ltd., of Glasgow, has quadruple screws, and drives by steam turbines, which develop a speed of 25 knots per hour. She is a product of the latest shipbuilding art and has the latest in accommodation and luxury.  
(3) The "Empress of Australia," after calling at the ports of the Pacific on account of her hurricane and comfortable construction, with a length of 351 feet and a 40-horsepower engine of 22,000 tons, was the first foreign aid to reach that stricken country and today the world has learned of unaccountable feats of bravery, deeds of generosity and self-sacrifice on the part of several Canadians, who at the time of the turmoil were engaged in missionary or mercantile fields.  
To Captain Robinson of the "Empress of Australia," and Captain Kent, river pilot, the country stands indebted for the rescue and care of 4,000 lives. ## CONVICTS FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

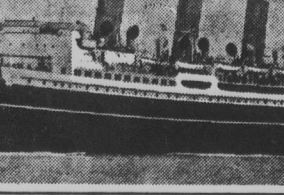
Killed Three Guards—Two Prisoners Take Own Lives At End of Struggle  
Eddyville, Ky., Oct. 8.—A storming party late Saturday entered the mess hall fortress here of the Kentucky state penitentiary held by the convict murderers since Wednesday when they were asked, not only for this week, but for all time in eliminating fire risks. The fire destruction of New Brunswick alone during the six months from January 1 to June 30, 1923, exclusive of forest fires, was \$1,246,677. Besides this many lives have been lost through fires. The Fire Prevention Board has been active in the campaign and placards have been placed in prominent situations calling the attention of the people to the great need for more care in placing and storing of inflammable materials.  
While the churches have taken hold of the campaign for reducing the fire losses, the children in schools will have special instruction during this week in the matter of preventing fires. It has been pointed out that the majority of fires result from carelessness and the object of this week's campaign is to bring home to everyone the need for care in handling all inflammable materials, as well as in the use of lighting fires.  
The great fire loss in New Brunswick means that each man, woman and child in the province would have to pay \$3 for the fire losses during the first six months of this year, but it was pointed out by one citizen that a family average five people, with one of these caring the living for the lot. The fire loss meant \$15 each six months to each family in the province. By care on the part of every citizen, it was shown that this amount could be greatly reduced. The campaign will be carried on during the week under the direction of the Fire Prevention Board but it is hoped that the people themselves will make the campaign a perpetual affair thus saving themselves and the province from the great losses occasioned by fire.

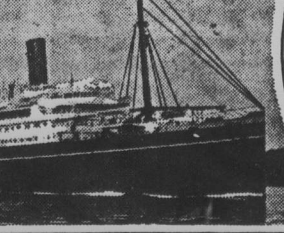
Need for Care Spoken of From Report Says Many Are Dying To Have a Ride In It.

1. Have all flues and chimneys properly cleaned before attempting to use them.  
2. Look very carefully at the chimney or flue, at the point just above the peak of the roof where the chimney goes through, as the lower part may have settled and the upper portion, being held up by the roof timbers, may have pulled away, leaving an open space or break in the chimney that will permit sparks slipping through into the attic or concealed space.  
3. Be sure that all flue holes that are not to be used this year have good metal stops, as innumerable fires are caused by sparks through peering over unused pipe holes in chimneys.  
4. Clean the ventilating collars around all flues, removing all lint, cobwebs and dust, leaving nothing in the ventilator, in this way permitting the air to cool the pipe where it goes through.  
5. Be careful that the supply of kindling wood is not piled up in the yard in such manner as to carry fire to your house, in case your neighbor's house should burn.  
6. It is best to keep all kindling and boxes in sheds, stables or basements, in orderly piles, and not to have papers or excelsior mixed with it.  
7. Extra caution should be used in the handling of gasoline. In the winter months all windows and doors are closed, eliminating the possibility of the air blowing the inflammable vapours away.  
8. Never use gasoline inside the house for cleaning, and when compelled to use it for any other purpose do not forget that you are handling a powerful explosive which may endanger your life and property.  
9. Remove all dry grass and leaves from your premises before setting one carelessly through a match away.  
10. Do not dry clothing and inflammable materials above or near hot stoves.
