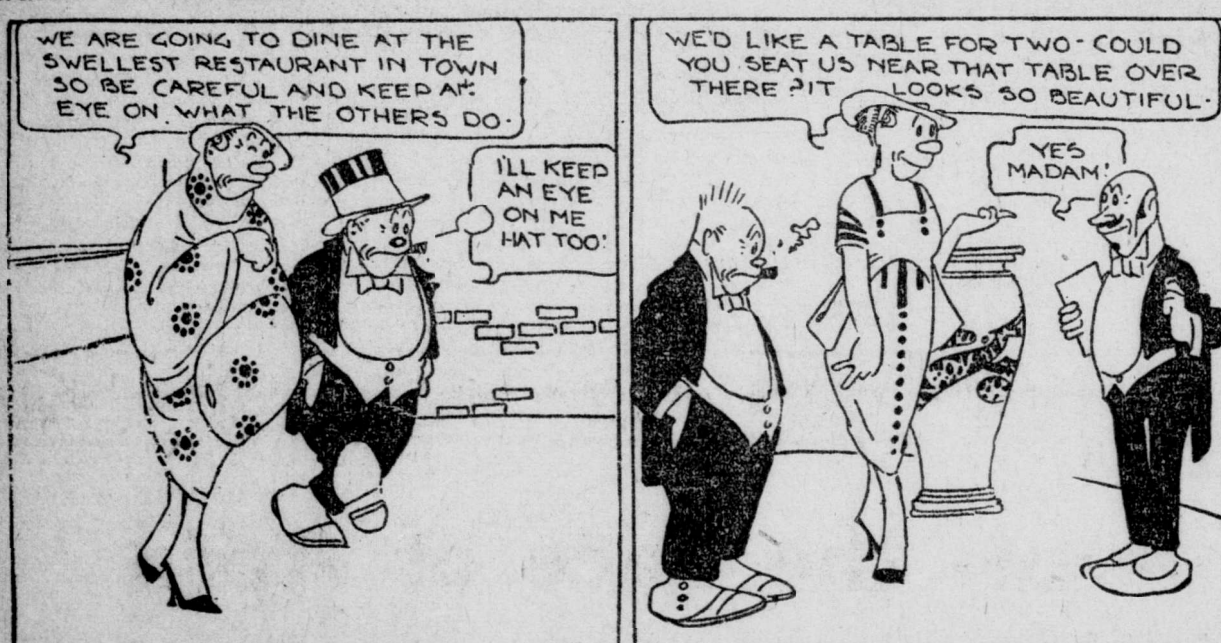

Will Announce Date and Place Of Bout Saturday

Official Announcement of Details for Dempsey-Carpentier Battle to Come

NEW YORK, March 30.—The place, date and all details of the Dempsey-Carpentier heavyweight championship bout will be announced in this city on Saturday, April 9. This statement was officially made by Promoter Tex Rickard here to-day. In making the announcement Rickard said that, while he was not prepared to definitely designate the site of the contest at this time, he had finally decided to hold the match in the United States and that all offers from points outside of this country had been carefully considered and rejected.

While the date of the contest has been semi-officially fixed for some time as Saturday, July 2, the place and the general conditions to govern the bout have never been authoritatively stated. Rickard said to-day that he had been in conference with Manager Kearns, representing Dempsey, and with the American representative of Carpentier, and that all parties to the contract had agreed upon April 9 as the date for the disclosing of the site of the battle.

J. K. L. Ross Horses At The Woodbine

MANY CITIES ANGLING FOR PLACE IN M-O

Akron, Ohio, and Others Would Make League Double "AA" Circuit

PORT HURON, March 30.—Several cities are inquiring about obtaining a berth in the Michigan-Ontario League since Port Huron took over the Battle Creek franchise. Montreal and Ottawa have long been interested in gaining admittance to the Mint circuit, and the latest applicant is Akron, Ohio, who recently lost its International League franchise to Newark.

President G. H. Marnes, of the Mint League, is making an investigation of the Akron offer, and it is rumored two cities now in the International circuit have signified their willingness to consider joining the new organization, provided Montreal, Ottawa, Akron, Hamilton, Flint and London make up the balance of the league.

This would insure class "AA" ball, and from a geographical standpoint, and with a combined population of more than two and a half millions in the eight cities, one of the best circuits in organized baseball would be possible.

President Marnes is known to favor Port Huron over Ottawa, the latter being much farther away, while the former has Marysville and Sarnia adjoining to draw from.

Western Ontario Racing Circuit Expands This Year

Trotting and Pacing Horsemen Meet at Galt Yesterday and Allot Dates

GALT, March 30.—The executive of the Western Ontario Trotting and Pacing Circuit at a meeting here to-day laid its plans for the coming season's racing with prospects for a much more successful season than last year, the first of its operation. This was practically assured to-day with the inclusion in the circuit of three new places, Hamilton, Ancaster and Stratford. Woodstock dropping out, and instead of a nine-place route at least 12 is now assured and more are expected to join later.

It is expected that entries will be attracted from the United States because of the fact that some of the associations will stage three-day meets and thus a couple of months continuous racing will be provided the horsemen.

It was unanimously agreed that all associations in the circuit should this year strictly enforce the rule that entries closed seven days before the opening day of a meet and further that it be advertised in racing circuits that trotters are allowed four seconds handicap in the pacing events.

J. Lord, of Hamilton, presided over the meeting and representatives were present from Hamilton, Stratford, Guelph, Kitchener, Simcoe and Galt. W. McLaughlin, of Toronto, secretary of the National Trotting and Pacing Association, was also in attendance at the meeting.
