

REPORT OF THE ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE UNITED BAPTIST WOMEN'S MISSIONARY CONVENTION OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES

Held in the Baptist Church, Bridgetown, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, October 10-12

Beautiful October weather greeted the delegates to the United Baptist Women's Missionary Union that met at the Baptist Church Bridgetown, at ten o'clock on Wednesday morning, Oct. 11th.

The Convention was opened by the President, Mrs. David Hutchinson of St. John's.

A number of executive meetings were held on Monday and Tuesday, and Tuesday evening was employed in registering the delegates and having social intercourse in the church vestry. It was found that almost every hamlet town and city of the Maritime Provinces were represented at the convention. A splendid impression prevailed with the business like manner in which the great interests of mission work were handled by the officials.

The financial report was the first taken up and read by Miss Clara Fullerton. This was followed by a report of the secretary, Miss Emma Hume. This was a long report of the financial aspect of the Union.

There is a great call for nurses in the foreign mission field, as the people are the more readily reached in this manner. There is only one in the field at the present time.
