"Mission of Guinea and Sierra Leone" "ill have to lonk, for the means of commencing and sustaining its pious efforts.
Tlo die wants of that Mission, and the best way of meeting them, the attention of our readers is directed in another portion al our journal. The Bishop of Constantina* is to bo accompanied to Sierra leeone, wilh about 15 Missionaries, of whom only iliree or four are 13ritish subjects. Five are Spaniards: and tho remaining six or seven belong to a French Missionary Congregation, dediented, by vow, to the Evangelising of the Blacks. Catholic Charity knows not the Aristocracy of Skin, nor the distinction of Nation. Whether the good to be dono remains with the Neophyte, or whether it draws to it, besides, the worldly adrancement of some foreign lisuropean power, to whose pursidiction that Neophy: happans to bejong, is a guection quite indifferent to the Missionary. The Spaniard, who follows his Lordship to the lBritish setlements in ! Western Africa, will labour there for the good of all, ss he would have laboured for the good of his own mation; and alhough the British Crown, and not the Crown of France, will reap the rich temporal blessings of his zeal and his sacrifices, the French Nissionary will emulate in Guinea the giories of the Senegal. Nor tloes the Continent rest here ats charity. The Missionary Congregation of Priests, already mentioned, have undertaken to furnish His Lordship with yearly supplies of Mis. sionaries, from France. "It is on this devoted body," says 1r. Barion, in a letter now lying before us, "that I found, under God, my principal hopes, of mak ing a permanent establistment on the unkindly soil of Africa."
