

kept in well shaded quarters. The young feathers take on tan easily, and nothing will remove it. All the quarters must be kept scrupulously clean so that the birds may not become soiled, but be fit for show at any time with a little brightening up of comb, wattles and legs. Crowding must be avoided Fully one-half the deformities and diseases acquired at this season are caused by crowding.

Now mature your plans for housing the stock in winter. If extra accommodation is needed now is the time to provide it. Don't wait till cold weather forces you to do it; if you do it will be hospital you will require. Lay in a good supply of road dust or fine sand to litter the floors and for dust-baths for the fowls in winter, and look after a supply of gravel and old mortar.
